## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Investment Objectives and Strategies

The investment objective of TD U.S. Disciplined Equity Alpha Fund™ (the “Fund”) is to seek to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of issuers in the United States. In seeking to achieve this objective, the Fund utilizes a disciplined quantitative equity strategy that exploits market inefficiencies related to the pricing and valuations of securities in order to generate alpha, defined as the returns in excess of expected returns for the level of risk assumed. As a result of its strategy, the Fund will generally invest in a large number of securities, broadly diversified across all sectors of the S&P 500 Index. The strategy aims to optimize the Fund’s exposure to stocks that are expected to outperform the overall market, while factoring in implementation costs and seeking to avoid uncompensated risks. The Fund may also use derivatives to gain exposure to equity instruments, enhance income and provide downside risk protection.

### Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as outlined in the simplified prospectus.

### Results of Operations

The Investor Series units of the Fund returned 30.3% for the year ended December 31, 2024 (the “Reporting Period”), versus 35.8% for the Fund’s product benchmark and general market index, the S&P 500 Total Return Index (Net Dividend, C\$). Unlike the product benchmark and general market index, the Fund’s return is quoted after the deduction of fees and expenses. Returns for other series of the Fund may vary, largely due to differences in fees and expenses. Refer to the Past Performance section for returns of various series of the Fund.

### Market Update

The U.S. economy continued to expand over the Reporting Period, demonstrating its relative strength despite tight financial conditions and softer economic activity elsewhere around the world. Consumer spending was the key driver of growth as U.S. households proved their resiliency amid high borrowing costs and elevated inflation. However, small cracks began to emerge as the Reporting Period progressed. Relatively strong manufacturing activity began to fade in response to slower demand. Real estate market activity waned with high mortgage rates weighing on demand. A slowing U.S. labour market raised concerns about the health of the overall economy. The U.S. unemployment rate rose to its highest level since 2021. In response to the slowing labour market and easing inflationary pressures, the U.S. Federal Reserve Board (“Fed”) lowered the target range of its benchmark interest rate by 1.00% to 4.25%-4.50%. At its final meeting of the Reporting Period, the Fed lowered its expectations for the number of interest rate cuts in 2025 given inflation was still above its 2% target and economic conditions were relatively stable.

U.S. equities delivered a strong gain over the Reporting Period, with 10 of 11 sectors generating positive returns. Communication services, information technology and consumer discretionary were the strongest-performing sectors, while materials, health care and real estate were the weakest-performing sectors.

The communication services and information technology sectors were key drivers of U.S. equity market gains over the Reporting Period. Both benefited from the progress and expected capabilities of artificial intelligence. Investors also raised the valuations of stocks in both sectors in response to lower interest rates. U.S. consumer spending remained resilient despite tight financial conditions, which benefited the consumer discretionary sector.

### Key Contributors/Detractors

The Fund generated a positive return over the Reporting Period but underperformed its product benchmark.

- The Fund’s security selection within the financials sector detracted from performance owing to positions in multiple insurance companies that underperformed the sector.
- The Fund’s stock selection within the consumer discretionary sector detracted from performance owing to an underweight position in an electric car manufacturer that returned more than 75%.
- The Fund’s security selection within the consumer staples sector detracted from performance mainly owing to its position in an agricultural products company that was down more than 20%.
- The Fund’s underweight exposure to the health care sector contributed to performance as the sector underperformed the product benchmark.
- The Fund’s stock selection within the health care sector contributed to performance owing to its position in a company that provides services related to health care, and position in a biopharmaceuticals research company, as these two companies returned over 30% and 20%, respectively.

### Assets

The O-Series units experienced a significant increase in assets due to investor purchase activity.

### Recent Developments

The Portfolio Adviser expects consumer and business activity to pick up after several central banks began to ease monetary policy and loosen financial conditions. Still, several risks to the outlook persist, such as geopolitical tensions, the potential for inflationary pressures to reemerge and the impact of potential tariffs on global trade activity. Many central banks are expected to keep lowering interest rates, which could further boost global economic activity in 2025 and help the global economy avoid a recession.

Although the S&P 500 Index faced bouts of volatility, it ended the Reporting Period strong and with plenty of momentum heading into 2025, driven by encouraging economic data that underscored the strength of the U.S. economy. The Fed has embarked on a long-awaited cycle of cutting interest rates as inflationary pressures have eased, and focus has shifted to employment numbers and overall economic health. Consumer sentiment has also lifted in recent months, and lower interest rates should allow greater discretionary spending.

In the Portfolio Adviser's view, the Republican sweep of the U.S. election may bode well for U.S. equity markets if the pattern of Donald Trump's first term is any guide. With that said, Trump's proposed policies also bring risks, as his proposed universal tariff policy and plans to deport undocumented immigrants could be inflationary. Furthermore, universal tariffs may bring the risk of retaliatory tariffs from other countries, which could negatively affect U.S. exporters.

Based on the Portfolio Adviser's rules-based quantitative approach, the Fund's largest overweight allocations were in the consumer discretionary and financials sectors. Within the consumer discretionary sector, the Portfolio Adviser favours companies in sub-industries such as apparel retail and homebuilding. Within the financials sector, the Portfolio Adviser favours companies in sub-industries such as property & casualty insurance and life & health insurance. The Portfolio Adviser relies on return forecast modelling and risk modelling to optimize the Fund's positioning.

Effective July 25, 2024, the Fund was renamed from TD U.S. Quantitative Equity Fund.

#### **Related Party Transactions**

Affiliates of TD Asset Management Inc. ("TDAM") may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as in connection with banking (including deposit taking), custody, securityholder account maintenance and reporting, brokerage and derivatives transactions.

#### *Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Adviser:*

TDAM, a wholly-owned subsidiary of The Toronto-Dominion Bank ("TD"), is the manager, trustee and portfolio adviser of the Fund. The Fund pays TDAM an annual management fee, which may vary for each series of the Fund. The Fund also pays TDAM an annual administration fee of 0.20% per simplified prospectus, calculated and accrued as a percentage of the net asset value, with respect to the Investor Series and D-Series units of the Fund.

#### *Distributor:*

Certain series of units of the Fund are distributed through brokers and dealers including TD Waterhouse Canada Inc. ("TDWCI"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of TD. TDWCI, like other dealers, is paid a trailer commission by TDAM for distributing certain series of units of the Fund. Trailer commissions are paid by TDAM out of the management fees it receives from the Fund and are based on the average value of assets held by each dealer.

#### *Registrar and Transfer Agent:*

TD is the registrar and transfer agent of the Fund, and as such maintains all unitholder records, processes purchase, switch, conversion and redemption orders, issues investor statements and prepares annual tax reporting information on behalf of the Fund.

TD earns a foreign exchange spread when unitholders switch between units of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with TD for which TD earns a fee.

#### *Administration and Securityholder Services:*

TDWCI, in addition to acting as a dealer, also provides administration and securityholder services to the Private Series units of the Fund for which such costs are reflected in the operating expenses for the Private Series units of the Fund. These services include securityholder account maintenance and reporting.

#### *Custodian:*

TD is the sub-custodian of the Fund and may hold a portion of the assets (including cash and investments) of the Fund.

#### *Buying and Selling Securities:*

TDAM has established an independent review committee ("IRC") which acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting any conflict of interest matters referred to it by TDAM. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The Fund did not engage in any portfolio transactions requiring IRC approval during the Reporting Period.

As such, the Fund's accounting policies for measuring the fair value of investments in the financial statements are substantively consistent with those used in measuring the net asset value ("NAV") for transactions with unitholders.

The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial periods. These tables are not intended to be a reconciliation of the net assets per unit.

Management Expense Ratio Before Waivers or Absorptions is based on total expenses and excludes the management fees on the portion of the NAV the Fund invests in the underlying funds that are managed by TDAM or its affiliates. There will be no duplication of management fees paid to TDAM or its affiliates. Any waivers or absorptions may be discontinued at any time by TDAM at its discretion without notice.

<sup>3</sup> The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average NAV during the stated period. Where a Fund invests in units of any underlying fund, the TER presented for the Fund includes the portion of TERs, if available, of the underlying fund(s) attributable to this investment.

<sup>4</sup> The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the stated period. The higher a fund's PTR, the greater the trading costs payable, directly or indirectly, by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the fiscal year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

<sup>5</sup> The Fund does not pay any management fees or operating expenses with respect to the O-Series units of the Fund, but may have a MER as a result of its holdings in underlying fund(s), representing the weighted average MER of those underlying fund(s) for the reporting period.

## Management Fees

As manager and trustee of the Fund, TDAM is responsible for the overall business and affairs of the Fund, including activities related to making units of the Fund available to investors, and providing, or arranging for the provision of, investment advisory services and marketing services to the Fund. In consideration for the provision of such services, each series of the Fund, other than Private Series units and O-Series units, pays TDAM a management fee.

Management fees are calculated and accrued on a daily basis for each applicable series based on the net asset value of that series and paid monthly to TDAM.

The simplified prospectus discloses a specified annual management fee rate that TDAM can charge for each series of the Fund. Where TDAM chooses to charge a management fee rate below the specified annual management fee rate, the difference represents a waiver of management fees. TDAM may waive all or a portion of the management fees being charged to the Fund, which may be discontinued at any time by TDAM at its discretion without notice to unitholders.

Unitholders in the O-Series pay a negotiated fee directly to TDAM.

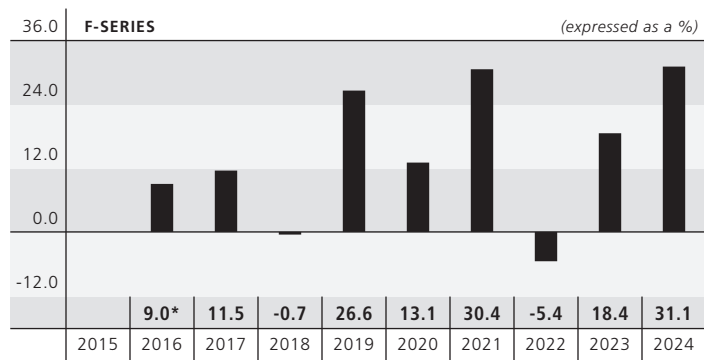
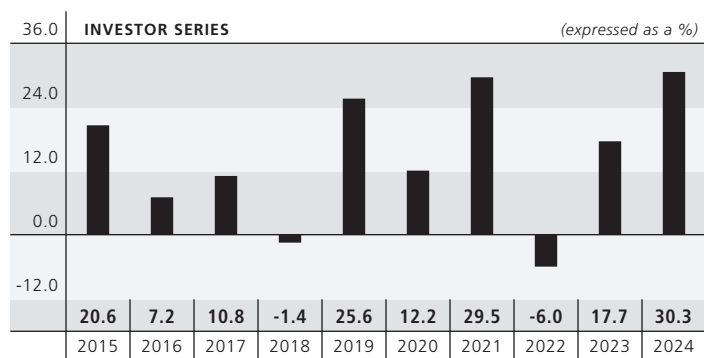

## Past Performance

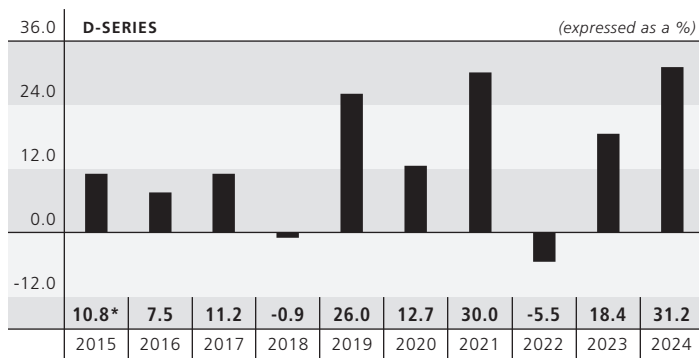

### Year-by-year returns

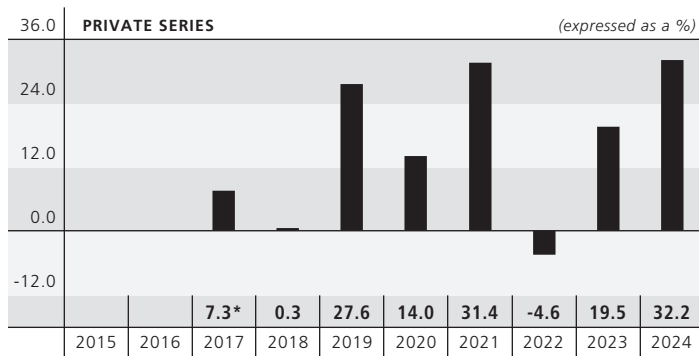

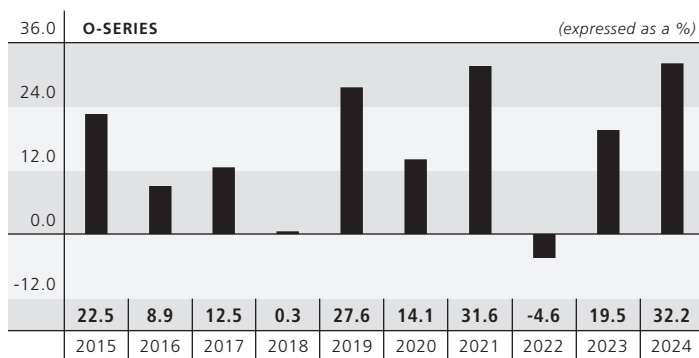
\* From September 13, 2016 (commencement of operations) to December 31, 2016
