# Celebrating \$1 billion in community investment

**In 2018, TD set a \$1 billion community investment goal for 2030 through the TD Ready Commitment, focused on supporting community-led initiatives in Canada and the U.S. In 2025, we reached that goal early, contributing to meaningful impacts for communities.**

## Responding to communities' needs

TD has long supported the communities where we live and work through our corporate citizenship. We brought that work together under the TD Ready Commitment, a platform connecting the power of our people and our philanthropy. Through this approach, TD supports community organizations responding to a range of social and economic needs, including shifts in the labour market, the impacts of a global pandemic, rising housing pressures, and increasing climate risks.

That support shows up through a mix of community-led and colleague-driven initiatives in Canada and the U.S. These initiatives focus on helping people build skills, open pathways to income stability, strengthen social connection, expand access to housing and care, and enhance green spaces.

## Connecting supports to help build stability

Homeward Bound is a Toronto-based program that brings together education, employment pathways, housing stability, and family supports to help single mothers move from financial insecurity and homelessness to sustainable employment. By aligning these supports over time, the initiative helps participants transform their lives in ways that can extend across generations.

## 2018–2019

## 2023–2024

### Helping address growing housing pressures



Rising housing costs, limited availability, and growing affordability gaps were placing added strain on communities across North America, reinforcing the need for both immediate and longer-term approaches to housing stability. During this period, TD supported community-led housing efforts focused on helping strengthen access to affordable housing, improve housing stability for residents, and contribute to broader understanding of how housing challenges can be addressed over time.
