

Cookies Notice for users from the European Economic Area or the United Kingdom

This Website uses first and third party technologies (referred to as “Cookies”). You can learn more about how we use Cookies and how you can manage them by reading the information below.

1. What are Cookies?

Cookies are pieces of information downloaded to your device by websites you visit. When you visit websites that use these Cookies, they help to improve your online experience and provide the owners of the site with business and marketing information.

We group Cookies depending on the purpose they serve (see section 2), how long they last (see section 3), and where they come from (see section 4).

2. Our Use of Cookies

We use the following categories of Cookies:

- *Essential Cookies*

These Cookies are used for core functionality and the operation of our Website. For example, they let you securely access and use features, as well as maintaining your privacy while using the Website. Essential Cookies are always on, you can set your browser to block or alert you about these tools, but without this data certain services cannot be provided. This data is not used for marketing purposes nor for other purposes.

Other type of cookies, such as Performance Cookies and Targeting Cookies are currently switched off for users who visit this Website from the European Economic Area or the United Kingdom.

3. How long can a Cookie last?

The duration of a Cookie can be set when the Cookie is created and can be classified as:

- *Session Cookies*

These Cookies are temporary and expire once you close your browser (or once your session ends).

- *Persistent Cookies*

This category encompasses all Cookies that remain on your hard drive until you erase them, or your browser does, depending on the cookie’s expiration date. All persistent Cookies have an expiration date written into their code, but their duration can vary.

4. Third Party Cookies

Third party Cookies are set by a website other than the one you are currently on (“Third Party Cookies”). We use vendors that may set up Third Party Cookies on your devices when you use our Website to allow them to deliver the services they are providing to us. Please review the Cookie and privacy policies of these sites to understand how they may use Cookies and your information.

5. How do I change my cookie settings?

Most web browsers give you the option to accept or decline Cookies, to delete existing Cookies and to alert you when websites set or access Cookies. You can block Cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some Cookies. The Help function on your browser should tell you how to do this. However, please note that if you use your browser settings to block some or all Cookies (including Essential Cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of our Website.
