¹ Excludes MBNA which was acquired by TDBG in December 2012 as the data is not available and cannot be reasonably estimated.

² The paper data that was known and available to management was used in determining the paper use; however, the Bank was not able to substantiate all paper that may have been purchased through alternative suppliers or printers.

³ Tree is defined as a woody perennial plant with a main stem (or trunk) that grows to a height of more than 5 metres and having a diameter of 10 centimetres at a height of 1.5 metres above ground. It takes an average of 24 trees to produce a ton of paper (or 21.77 trees to produce a metric tonne of paper) according to Conservatree.

⁴ Forest is defined as a tree canopy with an average density of 500 trees per hectare that are, in aggregate, at least an average height of 12 metres and an average diameter of 15 centimetres at a height of 1.5 metres above ground.
