<sup>1</sup> The paper data that was known and available to management was used in determining the paper use; however, the Bank was not able to substantiate all paper that may have been purchased through alternative suppliers or printers.

<sup>2</sup> Tree is defined as a woody perennial plant with a main stem (or trunk) that grows to a height of more than 5 metres and having a diameter of 10 centimetres at a height of 1.5 metres above ground. It takes an average of 24 trees to produce a ton of paper (or 21.77 trees to produce a metric tonne of paper) according to Conservatree.
