Interest Payment Dates:

Quarterly, on March 2, June 2, September 2 and December 2 of each year, beginning on September 2, 2021 (short first Interest Period) and ending on the Maturity Date.

Interest Payment Determination Date:

The date two U.S. Government Securities Business Days before each Interest Payment Date.

Observation Period:

In respect of each Interest Period, the period from, and including, the date two U.S. Government Securities Business Days preceding the first date in such Interest Period to, but excluding, the date two U.S. Government Securities Business Days preceding the Interest Payment Date for such Interest Period.

Business Day Convention:

Modified following; adjusted

Business Day:

Any weekday that is a U.S. Government Securities Business Day and is not a legal holiday in New York or Toronto and is not a date on which banking institutions in those cities are authorized or required by law or regulation to be closed.

U.S. Government Securities Business Day:

Any day except for a Saturday, a Sunday or a day on which the Securities Industry and Financial Markets Association recommends that the fixed income departments of its members be closed for the entire day for purposes of trading in U.S. government securities.

Canadian Bail-in Provisions:

The Notes are bail-inable notes (as defined in the accompanying prospectus supplement) and subject to conversion in whole or in part — by means of a transaction or series of transactions and in one or more steps — into common shares of the Bank or any of its affiliates under subsection 39.2(2.3) of the Canada Deposit Insurance Corporation Act (the "CDIC Act") and to variation or extinguishment in consequence, and subject to the application of the laws of the Province of Ontario and the federal laws of Canada applicable therein in respect of the operation of the CDIC Act with respect to the Notes. Optional Redemption by the Issuer for Tax Reasons:

In certain circumstances where the Issuer has or will become obligated to pay additional amounts (as described in the pricing supplement), the Issuer may, at its option, redeem the Notes in whole, but not in part, at any time before maturity, after giving not less than 10 nor more than 60 calendar days' notice to the holders of the Notes, at a redemption price equal to 100% of their principal amount together with accrued interest, if any, to, but excluding, the redemption date.
